

The Alabama Coalition Against Domestic Violence anticipates receiving and/or applying for the following formula and discretionary funding under the American Investment and Recovery Act of 2009:

**United States Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women, Grants to State Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Coalitions** \$78,125 for the period June 1, 2009—May 31, 2010. These funds will be used to hire a .50 FTE Economic Justice Coordinator who will work on poverty, economic development, and employment security issues facing survivors of domestic violence. These activities will include improving employer response to domestic violence, development of a domestic violence prevention plan for the state of Alabama, and expansion of asset development programs for survivors of domestic violence. **Status: Received**

**STOP Subgrant from the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs, Division of Law Enforcement Planning. Federal funding from the Office on Violence Against Women, United State Department of Justice.** \$60,000 for the period July 1, 2009—June 30, 2010. ACADV has applied to ADECA for these funds and, if awarded, they will be used to hire a full-time public education and outreach coordinator to develop a public relations and public education campaign aimed to both prevent domestic violence and improve system response through better public understanding of the causes and consequences of domestic violence and of the most effective solutions to the problem in Alabama and the nation. **Status: Applied.**

**Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-housing Subgrant from the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs, Division of Community Services. Federal funding from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.** ACADV has applied for \$7,827,125 from the Community Services Division of ADECA for the provision of case-management services to homeless women and children who are victims of domestic violence, the provision of rapid re-housing for these families through payment of rent and utility deposits for eligible families. These services would be provided in geographic areas that are not “entitlement” communities for Rapid Re-housing and Homeless Prevention Grants. ACADV also applied for funds under this funding stream to expand the balance of state Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) required for all subgrantees under this program. Anticipated funding period will be October 1, 2009—September 30, 2012. **Status: Applied**

**Office of Community Services, Department of Health and Human Services** ACADV partnered with the National Resource Center on Domestic Violence (the lead agency) and the Ohio Coalition Against Domestic Violence for funding that would be, for ACADV, in the amount of \$50,000 per year for three years. Funds would be used to improve community and local program capacity to support the economic empowerment of domestic violence survivors in the Alabama Black Belt. Anticipated funding period will be October 1, 2009—September 30, 2012. **Status: Applied**
